'Sex & Drugs & Rock & Roll' (15-113 mins)

The film covers the colourful and fantastical story of Ian Dury, one of Britain's most original and influential singer-songwriters of the last 30 years. Crippled at the age of ten by the debilitating disease, polio, and told he would

amount to nothing, Dury's dogged determination, perseverance and wit led to him becoming one of the founders of the punk movement in the 1970s. Much of the film's success lies with Andy Serkis's performance (touted as a BAFTA winner) as the late Essex singer who fought addiction, depression and illness en route to becoming a national treasure as gravel-voiced frontman of 'The Blockheads'. This is a fearless performance which brings Ian back to life with a fiercely charismatic turn that perfectly mirrors his snarling ferocity and earthy humour.
